SOPA Awards & Awards Categories

SOPA Awards for Editorial Excellence

The Society of Publishers in Asia Awards for Editorial Excellence were established in 1999 as a tribute to editorial excellence in both traditional and new media and are designed to honour excellence and to encourage editorial vitality throughout the region.

Growing industry recognition of the Awards as setting a benchmark for regional publishing has become evident in the year-on-year increase in entries. In 2005, a record 303 entries were received from Hong Kong, Taiwan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, Philippines, Australia, Thailand and the USA.

The awards cover a broad range of categories reflecting Asia's diverse geo-political environment and vibrant editorial scene. To encourage entries from both large and small publications, entries are classified by circulation size and language type – either English or Chinese.

Key to the Awards' growing success is the high calibre of international judges who preside over the Award entries. Each year, the number of judges wiling to dedicate their time to the Awards has grown and in 2005, there were 95 professional journalists, design experts and photographic editors collaborated to select the winners.

The SOPA Awards are co-ordinated by a committee of publishing professionals from the business and editorial sectors. These dedicated individuals volunteer their time throughout the year to ensure the Award rules, judges, entries, event, sponsorship and promotion all come together smoothly.

Corporate Support

Sponsorship is key to ensuring the Award's growth and over the past four years, SOPA has been fortunate to receive the support of InvestHK. As the Awards have grown, so too has the interest from corporations, and in 2005, the SOPA Awards gala dinner was supported by DHL and Factiva, a Dow Jones and Reuters company.

International Recognition

The SOPA Awards are supported by a number of international media organisations and regional media industry press: the Asia Media Journal, Ifra Asia, International Federation of the Periodical Press (FIPP), the World Editors Forum (WEF), and the editorial division of the World Association of Newspapers (WAN).

Reginald Chu

Reg Chua is the editor of The Asian Wall Street Journal. He joined the Journal in 1993 as Manila correspondent and opened the paper's Hanoi bureau in 1995. In January 1997 he moved to Hong Kong as deputy managing editor and was named editor in August that year.

Mark Clifford

Mark Clifford is the Publisher and Editor-in-Chief of The Standard, a position he has held since January 2004. From 1999 until 2003 he was the Hong Kong-based Asia Regional Editor for *BusinessWeek*. Clifford is the co-author, with WTO Director-General Supachai Panitchpakdi, of "China and the WTO: Changing China, Changing World Trade." Clifford is also the author of several other books, including "Troubled Tiger: Businessmen, Bureaucrats and Generals in South Korea" and



co-author of "Meltdown: Asia's Boom, Bust and Beyond". He was a contributor to "China's Century". He moved to South Korea in 1987, taking up a position as a Seoulbased correspondent for the *Far Eastern Economic Review*. He has lived in Hong Kong since 1992.



Tom Leander

Mr Leander was appointed editor-in-chief of *CFO Asia* magazine in December 2001. He has covered CFO stories across Asia, from profiling top CFOs in China to exploring how one CFO successfully fought local unions by teaching finance to coal miners in a mine north of Hyderabad. Leander's story, "The Great Debate," the first cover to be published globally by all three *CFO magazines*, won an award for feature writing from the American Society of Business Publications Editors for 2001.


Robyn Meredith

Robyn Meredith is Senior Editor, Asia for *Forbes* Magazine, based in Hong Kong. Robyn joined *Forbes* as its Detroit Bureau Manager in April 2000 to write about the auto industry. One of her *Forbes* articles was included in the 2002 Edition of the book "The Best Business Stories of the Year." From January, 1996 until April 2000 Robyn was a Detroit correspondent for *The New York Times*, where she covered the auto industry and other Midwestern news. She spent the 1998-1999 academic year as a Michigan Journalism Fellow at the University of Michigan



Business School. Robyn wrote for *USA Today* as a business reporter in 1995. She spent the previous two years as a reporter in the Washington bureau of the *American Banker* newspaper, where her reporting exposed a pattern of insider deals at savings and loans that led to four Congressional hearings and an overhaul of U.S. banking regulations governing initial public offerings.

Gene Mustain

Gene Mustain is Director of the Reporting and Writing Programme and an assistant professor at the Journalism and Media Studies Centre of The University of Hong Kong. He has written three non-fiction books and was an investigative reporter and special-projects writer for the *New York Daily News* and the *Chicago Sun-Times* before coming to Hong Kong in 1999. He also was managing editor of suburban weekly and daily newspapers in Illinois. As a reporter, he has covered major stories around the world – from the demise of apartheid in South Africa to political conflict in Northern Ireland and from race crimes in Germany to airline disasters in France. He has also worked in film and television, as co-producer for a Home Box Office movie based on one of his books, and as a consultant to ABC Television and the Discovery Channel for documentaries based on his newspaper stories.

John Ridding

John Ridding is the Editor and Publisher of the *Financial Times* Asia and Chairman of Pearson in Asia. Prior to his appointment John was deputy editor from 2001 and managing editor from 1999. He joined the *Financial Times* in 1987 and has held a series of posts including Hong Kong bureau chief, Paris correspondent, deputy features editor, Korea correspondent, UK companies reporter and foreign desk correspondent. Between 1986 and 1987 he worked at Oxford Analytica on the Asia Pacific desk. John graduated from Oxford University with a first class honours degree in philosophy, politics and economics. John has reported widely on Asia and regularly speaks on regional and international affairs. He also frequently appears on international television and radio programmes.

Azmar Sukandar is Senior Public Affairs Manager, *TIME* and *FORTUNE* Asia. 


