

About the SOPA Awards for Editorial Excellence

The Society of Publishers in Asia Awards for Editorial Excellence were established in 1999 as a tribute to editorial excellence in both traditional and new media and are designed to honor excellence and to encourage editorial vitality throughout the region.

Growing industry recognition of the Awards as setting a benchmark for regional publishing has become evident in the year-on-year increase in entries. This year, on the 10th Anniversary of the Award, a record high of 629 entries were received from Hong Kong, China, Taiwan, Malaysia, Singapore, Philippines, India, Korea and the USA.

The Awards cover a broad range of categories reflecting Asia's diverse geo-political environment and vibrant editorial scene. To encourage entries from both large and small publications, entries are classified by circulation size and language type – either English or Chinese.

Key to the Award's growing success is the high caliber of international judges who preside over the Award entries. The SOPA Awards has consistently secured judges from many of the region's leading newspapers and consumer and trade magazines – a reflection of the stature of the Awards. Each year, the number of judges willing to dedicate their time to the Awards has grown and this year SOPA comprised of professional journalists, design experts and photographic editors collaborated to select winners.

The SOPA Awards are co-ordinated by a committee of publishing professionals from the business and editorial sectors. These dedicated individuals volunteer their time throughout the year to ensure the Award rules, judges, entries; event, sponsorship and promotion all come together smoothly.

Corporate Support

Sponsorship is key to ensuring the Award's growth and over the past years, SOPA has been fortunate to receive the continuous support of InvestHK. As the Awards have grown, so too has the interest from corporations, and in 2008, the event was also sponsored by CLSA and IPSOS.

Kevin Brown - Chairman

Kevin was appointed Asia News Editor of the *Financial Times* in December 2004, and is based in Hong Kong. He joined the *Financial Times* in 1980 in London, and has been Parliamentary Correspondent, Transport Correspondent, Australasia Correspondent, National News Editor, Chief Political Correspondent, Industry Editor, UK Affairs Editor, and Personal Finance Editor.

He is responsible for the news gathering operation throughout the Asia/Pacific region, for the presentation of Asian news in the Asia edition and in the FT's three other global editions, and for the Asian news coverage of FT.com.

Kevin has specialized in politics throughout much of his career, and has covered general elections in five countries (the UK, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore and Fiji). He is married with one daughter, and his other interests include 19th Century English literature, watching cricket and painting. He is trying to learn Cantonese, without success.

Before joining the FT, Kevin worked for *Lloyd's List*, the international shipping and insurance daily newspaper, and for several other UK newspapers.

David Plott - Head of Judges

David Plott is a specialist in business and financial journalism, with almost 20 years of experience as a reporter and editor. Prior to joining the faculty at The University of Hong Kong's Journalism and Media Studies Centre, he was the editor-in-chief of the Far Eastern Economic Review. After reporting stints at the Kansas City Times and the St. Petersburg Times in the United States, he joined Dow Jones in 1987 as a copy editor for Dow Jones Newswires . He was transferred to Zurich



a year later, where he spent six years covering business and economic issues in Europe, including OPEC and the Uruguay Round trade negotiations. He was transferred to Singapore in 1994 as news editor, where he directed Asian energy and commodities coverage. In 1997 he set up a training program for *Newswires* in Asia and, in 1998, became senior news editor for *Asia-Pacific*, with responsibility for 16 bureaus in the region. He joined the *Far Eastern Economic Review* in January 2000 as a Managing Editor and became the Deputy Editor 18 months later. Plott has an undergraduate degree from the University of California at Berkeley and an MA and Ph.D. from Harvard University. He has taught literature and history at Harvard and at the University of Grenoble in France. His literary essays and reviews have appeared in the *American Literary Almanac*, *Contemporary Literary Criticism*, *The Wall Street Journal*, the *Chicago Tribune*, the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, *Barron's*, the *Far Eastern Economic Review*, the *St. Petersburg Times*, and elsewhere. Plott is currently managing editor of *Global Asia*, a new quarterly publication of the Seoul-based East Asia Foundation.





Zoher Abdoolcarim

Zoher Abdoolcarim was appointed Asia Editor of *TIME International* in June 2008. One of Asia's most well-known and experienced journalists, Zoher has traveled the region, as a reporter and editor, for more than 25 years. He joined *AsiaWeek* in 1980, and spent a total of 16 years there rising through the ranks to managing editor. When *AsiaWeek* ceased publication in 2001, Zoher moved over to *TIME Asia* as a Senior Editor.

From 1993-1996, Zoher was the Economics Editor and Assistant Managing Editor at *Asian Business*, a Singapore-owned business magazine. He has also had reporting stints as a foreign correspondent in Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, Brunei and the Philippines.

An ethnic Indian, Zoher was born and raised in Hong Kong. He holds a Journalism Degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and lives in Hong Kong with his wife and son. Zoher's family has been in Hong Kong since the 19th century. He becomes TIME's first Asia editor who is a native of Hong Kong.

Cliff Buddle

Cliff Buddle is Deputy Editor of the South China Morning Post. He has worked as a journalist for the last 26 years. Mr Buddle began his career as a news agency reporter at the Central Criminal Court in London. In 1994 he was hired by the South China Morning Post and brought to Hong Kong. He was the Post's Chief Court Reporter for six years, during which he covered a wide variety of cases including most of the landmark constitutional legal battles which followed Hong Kong's return to China. Since then, he has worked as an editor of the opinion pages, news editor, and chief



leader writer. From time to time, he has also written columns on legal affairs. He was appointed Deputy Editor in 2005.

Mr Buddle passed the Common Professional Examination (Post-graduate Diploma in Law) in 2000. Then, in 2005, he graduated from the Master of Laws (Human Rights) programme at the University of Hong Kong. His dissertation was on the legal framework underpinning Hong Kong's political system.


Tom Leander

Mr Leander was appointed Editor-in-Chief of *CFO Asia magazine* in December 2001. He has covered CFO stories across Asia, from profiling top CFOs in China to exploring how one CFO successfully fought local unions by teaching finance to coal miners in a mine north of Hyderabad. Leander's story, "The Great Debate," the first cover to be published globally by all three *CFO magazines*, won an award for feature writing from the American

He was Opinion Page Editor at Hong Kong Economic Times from 1997 to 1999. Since entering the field of journalism in 1992, he had also worked for Yazhou Zhoukan and Sing Tao Daily.

Mr Liu served as Chairman of the Hong Kong Journalists Association from 1998 to 1999 and as Board Member of the Foreign Correspondents' Club, Hong Kong from 1997 to 2001. He was the winner in English commentary in the Human Rights Press Awards in 1998.



Robyn Meredith

Robyn Meredith is Senior Editor, Asia for *Forbes* Magazine, based in Hong Kong. She has written cover stories on General Motors, Microsoft, Toyota, Li & Fung, and Infosys.

Ms Meredith joined *Forbes* as its Detroit Bureau Manager in April, 2000 to write about the auto industry. One of her *Forbes* articles was included in the 2002 Edition of the book "*The Best*

Business Stories of the Year."

From January, 1996 until April, 2000, Ms Meredith was a Detroit correspondent for *The New York Times*, where she covered the auto industry and other Midwestern news. She spent the 1998-1999 academic year as a Knight-Wallace Fellow at the University of Michigan Business School.

Ms Meredith wrote for *USA Today* as a business reporter in 1995. She spent the previous two years as a reporter in the Washington bureau of the *American Banker Newspaper*, where her reporting exposed a pattern of insider deals at savings and loans that led to four Congressional hearings and an overhaul of U.S. banking regulations governing initial public offerings.

Prior to taking on that role in Hong Kong, Frank was based in New York as *Newsweek's International* Special Projects Director, leading a team to develop innovative marketing solutions for

advertisers. Frank was also Project Coordinator for "The Power of Print," a landmark 2006 research project conceived and designed to help media professionals in Asia better understand the role and effectiveness of print advertising. He was Chairman of the Society of Publishers for 2004-2005.

Peter Stein

As Hong Kong bureau chief of *The Wall Street Journal*, Peter Stein runs a team of ten journalists who cover a broad range of Asiawide industry beats, including finance, M&A, technology, media, marketing, travel, aviation and health. As *The Wall Street Journal Asia's* Associate Editor, Mr Stein does public representation on behalf of *The Wall Street Journal's* Asian edition, is involved with expansion initiatives for the franchise and oversees its growing Chinese language website.



Previously, Mr Stein was Managing Editor for what was then called *The Asian Wall Street Journal* for seven years. He also served as the Senior Hong Kong Correspondent, writing on a broad range of issues surrounding the transfer of Hong Kong from British to Chinese sovereignty and coordinating the paper's Hong Kong coverage. He joined *The Asian Wall Street Journal* in 1989 after spending two years in Wuhan, China on a Yale-China Association fellowship, teaching English at Huazhong Normal University and studying Chinese. He graduated from Yale University with a bachelor's degree in comparative literature, and speaks both Mandarin and Cantonese.

Excellence in Explanatory Reporting Honorable Mention: International

Herald Tribune

Delhi's Transformation (by Amelia Gentleman)

Comment: India and its capital, the talk and walk of the economic world, revealed in social depth. The stories cover key aspects of the day-to-day aspects of life in a fast-growing metropolis, in an engaging but serious way. A well researched, well explained, diverse selection of stories that really got to the heart of the real Delhi in all its complicated glory from the people on the ground.

Award: TIME Asia Beyond Faith (by Aryn Baker)

Comment: Yet more insight into a potent global force that much of the rest of the world community still struggles to understand. An impressively lucid treatment of a complex and important topic that blended good contemporary reportage with insightful but not heavyhanded use of history to provide context. The reporter also did a good job of drawing out the nuances of Islam in the three countries covered - India, Pakistan and Bangladesh – which share many aspects of culture but where Islam has developed quite differently. The standout as it was jam packed full of information, explained in a simple yet cerebral way, and it's a complex, emotive and hugely important subject. The graphics were also extent.

Excellence in Feature Writing Honorable Mention: The Financial

Times

China Politics (by Richard McGregor) Comment: A series written with great style that gives readers a real idea off

how China's leadership works

Award: BusinessWeek

The Trouble with India & Broken China (by Steve Hamm, Nandini Lakshman, Pete Engardio, Dexter Roberts, Frederik Balfour, Bruce Einhorn)

Comment: Provides compelling new insights into a well covered story

Excellence in Human Rights Reporting

Honorable Mention: Financial Times North Korea (by Anna Fifield)

Comment: An excellent overview of one of the great unknowns that must be closely observed in Asia. Good reporting and analysis of key issues from different sides. It has taken a long time for the FT to tackle this issue and report on the plight of the refuges in China. This was another example of a journalist supplying excellent insight about a notoriously difficult subject. The reporter has clearly gotten to know her story, and was able to give the reader a detailed view of North Korea from a variety of angles.

Award: International Herald Tribune Inside Myanmar (by Choe Sang-Hun)

Comment: Beautifully, bravely written. Exemplary choice of viewpoints. Very strong vivid reporting, original insights from a strong variety of sources, giving different angles of a big story and personalizing it. Vivid portrayals of the different actors in this tragic drama that stuck in the mind. A remarkable job of obtaining and communicating detailed information in what must have been horrendously difficult and dangerous conditions. It's surprising that the reporter was able to talk to so many people when the authorities must have been watching everyone, citizen and tourists.

Excellence in Special Issue/ Special Section

Honorable Mention: Financial Times India at 60 (by Jo Johnson)

Comment: An excellent, highly readable analysis. Multiple views — including historical perspective provided by William Dalrymple — capture a country in which ostentation and growth vie with populations officially known as "Other Backward Classes."

Award: TIME Asia

Hong Kong 10th Anniversary Issue (by Zoher Abdoolcarim)

Comment: An excellent, highly targeted analysis of the many changes – subtle as well as general – that have taken place over the decade. Well written and cleanly designed, this package captures both the dynamism and the enduring Chineseness of this "pulsating organism." The continuing dance with the mother, mainland and the rise of an Asian expat community are clearly conveyed. There's historical perspective as well as the look ahead in this take on a Hong Kong that is "excited, acute, pushy, ceaselessly on the make".

Excellence in Feature Photography

Honorable Mention: Newsweek

Honor Thy Father (by Nicolas Righetti – Rezo)

Comment: Arresting, beautiful as well as weird images best display the story theme. Wonderfully poignant, surreal, images leave you wondering if such a place really exists in this world.

Award: International Herald Tribune Citizens of Nowhere (Greg Constantine)

Comments: These superb shots from photographer Greg Constantine capture the heart of the story in images that mesh both news and art. The images are all strong, and each one is composed to clearly illustrate the issues. Arresting, beautiful as well as weird images best display the story theme.

Honorable Mention: Bloomberg News Bhutto (by Warrick Page, Adam Ferguson, Acad Zaidi)

Comment: Stunning images, striking

Comment: The front page and section fronts are inviting and intelligent. The FT Weekend section fronts and inside pages are wonderful, with inviting features on their front pages and internal stuff that is witty and tastefully designed. It's a splendid newspaper.

Excellence in Magazine Design

Honorable Mention: TIME Asia
Best of Asia/India 60th Special/HK 10th
Anniversary issue (by Cecelia Wong)

Comment: The images are strong enough to overcome a somewhat dry design template. Clean design moves from a chunked front of the book to ample photo displays. Thoughtful mix of information graphics and typography make this once dowdy magazine the leader of the weekly pack. Put significant intelligence into design for reader appeal.

Award: Her World

The Best of Beauty/Get Your Man/ Obsessorise! (by Thng Wee Nee)

Comment: Lively layout with contemporary, punchy use of photography. Still looks like it is really stretching resources to build the magazine, but a creditable personality and flow. Well used white space allows for clean contemporary look.




